Short Course Descriptions

AEGR635 Legal Perspectives in Special Education

The legal implications of the law and its impact on parents, school community, society and K-12 curricula are researched and discussed. Regulations governing special education will be addressed, including IDEA, (Individuals with Disabilities Education Act) IEP (Individual Educational Plan), LRE (Least Restrictive Environment) and inclusion.

ED316 English Language Learners through Art Education

Students are introduced to current methods, strategies, and resources in reaching and teaching English Language Learners in the Art room. An overview of a variety of ELL teaching methods focusing on the use of the arts will be demonstrated. Students are offered multiple opportunities to observe, apply, and reflect upon varied instructional approaches to teach English Language Learners.

- A terminal degree or equivalent combination of education and professional/artistic experience, some college-level teaching experience is preferred, and evidence of professional activity is required
- Excellent oral, written, and interpersonal communication skills
- Ability to learn and use the Moodle learning platform on a regular basis
- Punctuality and dependability for class schedules is necessary
- Willingness to be flexible with class teaching schedules
- Willingness to teach and/or have experience teaching online courses
- Ability to use classroom technology such as projectors, SmartBoards, and department-specific software and/or hardware if needed.
- Knowledge of and ability to teach students about educational standards within your specialization

- Interest and activity within the Moore community of artists, designers, scholars, and students
