#### **Courses Available for Instruction**

## Spring 2026

ED 327 Art in Special Education (3.0 credits)

Saturdays 8:30am-12pm

This course provides Moore students with an on-campus, field-based teaching experience, working collaboratively to lead art lessons for children and teens within the Disabled community under the guidance of a qualified professor. Class sessions balance instruction in special education theory, Disability studies, and arts-based pedagogy with hands-on practice.

# Spring 2026

ED316 ELL Through Art Education (3.0 credits)

Tuesdays 6:30pm-9:20pm

This course introduces key concepts, theories, and strategies for teaching English Language Learners (ELLs) in the art classroom. The course prepares future educators to design inclusive, standards-based art lessons that support both content learning and English language

development. Students will study best practices in lesson planning and pedagogy, and gain firsthand experience through classroom observations in diverse educational settings. The course emphasizes practical tools and reflective strategies that empower educators to make ELLs active and successful participants in the art classroom.

**Note:** A second section of this course is running concurrently. There may be opportunities to collaborate with the instructor and students in that section.

- A terminal degree or equivalent combination of education and professional/artistic experience, some college-level teaching experience is preferred, and evidence of professional activity is required
- Excellent oral, written, and interpersonal communication skills
- Ability to learn and use the Moodle learning platform on a regular basis
- Punctuality and dependability for class schedules is necessary
- Willingness to be flexible with class teaching schedules
- Willingness to teach and/or have experience teaching online courses
- Ability to use classroom technology such as projectors, SmartBoards, and department-specific software and/or hardware if needed.
- Knowledge of and ability to teach students about educational standards within your specialization

# **Preferred Qualifications:**

- Interest and activity within the Moore community of artists, designers, scholars, and students
- Commitment to participating in the intellectual life of the department, and a willingness to participate in the life of the college.
