



Admissions Policy

1. Moore Application Requirements
 - a. High School or College Transcript
 - b. Artistic Portfolio
 - c. Application (completed via Moore's Website application or Common App)
2. Moore Admission Requirements
 - a. Received a high school diploma or possess an equivalency diploma or received an Associate's Degree by the time of matriculation. Applications may include 3 years of secondary school education or 1 semester of undergraduate education.
 - b. No specific course units are required from the secondary school academic study, outside of completing the secondary school's institution's guidelines for graduation.
 - c. 8-12 works demonstrating artistic and creative strengths, ideas, and technical skills OR for students majoring in Film & Digital Cinema or Interior Design, a writing sample.
 - d. Founded in 1848 under the mission to expand women's access to higher education, Moore College of Art & Design offers a women's college experience.
 - i. Undergraduate admission is open to otherwise qualified applicants: (i) assigned female at birth; or (ii) who self-identify as women, trans women, nonbinary, or gender nonconforming individuals, at the time of application. This policy will apply to applicants to be considered for enrollment for the 2021–22 academic year and beyond. —Adopted by Moore's Board of Trustees & Managers, May 5, 2020
3. Moore Application Review
 - a. Upon completing the application for admission and submitting the necessary required documents, the student's application is reviewed by appropriate admissions staff.
4. Verification of Documents
 - a. For application and admission, Moore may accept unofficial transcripts. For verification, all transcripts must include school formatting, including school headers and contact information, student details and contact information, and include courses and credits taken.
5. Announcement of Admission
 - a. Students are notified of their admission decision typically within five business days. All students receive announcements of their admission through electronic and postal mail.
