- The applicant should have prior experience teaching similar graphic design courses.
- Demonstration of cross/inter-multidisciplinary teaching methods and practice in the Foundation area is preferred. Applicant should have a specialty in one of the following areas or combination of areas: drawing, color theory, 2D and/or 3D Design, and/or research and project development courses.
