

SUMMER ART & DESIGN INSTITUTE 2022 PROGRAM FAQ

SADI BASIC PROGRAM DETAILS

- Summer Art & Design Institute (SADI) 2022: Sunday, July 10 – Saturday, August 6
- This four-week, three-credit residential program is open to young women & nonbinary students in grades 10 – 12 (choose according to your fall 2022 grade!)
- Registration is open through May 31, 2022
- Tuition deadline is June 1, 2022
- Registration fee (non-refundable): \$210
- Tuition, Room, and Meals: \$5,775
- Total fees due: \$5,985 (\$5,775 + \$210)

ACADEMIC INFO

When do I attend class?

Classes run in person Monday - Friday, 9:00 am – 4:00 pm, with a 1-hour lunch break from 12:00 pm – 1:00 pm.

Where are classes held and who teaches them?

Classes take place in Moore's beautiful BFA classrooms and labs – unique, modern facilities with state of the art equipment and technology! All SADI courses and workshops are taught by Moore's esteemed BFA faculty and a select group of Philadelphia-based artists and designers.

How many students are in each class?

Each class is sized according to social distancing policies specific to the classroom where learning is taking place. On average, classes tend to be about 10-12 students total.

Will I have homework?

Yes! Students should expect to have two hours of interesting, art-focused homework per day. SADI students complete their homework in Studio Coworking spaces with help from Moore's BFA students on most weekday evenings.

Will I receive grades, a transcript, and college credit for the courses I take?

Yes! Grades are issued for all students enrolled in Summer Art & Design Institute. Students who successfully complete SADI receive 3 undergraduate level credits. Students are graded for each class. These grades are averaged for the final 3 credits. After the conclusion of the program, you may

request a transcript showing the college credits you've earned. The 3 foundations year college credits you earn may always be used to get ahead at Moore. They are also accepted at most other colleges, depending on their admissions and credit transfer process.

Am I allowed to be absent?

No no-shows, please! SADI Students are expected to attend classes regularly and arrive on time. If you must miss a class session due to emergency or illness, you should notify SADI program staff and your faculty member in advance and arrange to make up all missed work.

What should I bring for the first day of class?

Moore provides the art supplies for all SADI classes. You just need to bring yourself and your provided portfolio bag!

HOUSING INFO

Am I required to live in the residence halls?

Yes indeed – all students are required to live on campus for SADI 2022!

Where are the dorms in relation to the classrooms?

Our campus consists of three buildings; Stahl Hall, the Wilson Building, and the Sarah Peter Building, which are all connected and enclosed! Students reside in Stahl Hall, which is steps away from the Dining Hall and just down the hallway from the Wilson and Sarah Peter Buildings, where classes take place. Students do not need to leave the building or go outside to enter the dining hall or go to class.

What amenities are available in the residence halls?

All rooms are arranged in two bedroom suites with an adjoining bathroom in the middle. Each room is equipped with built-in dressers and closets, two twin beds, two desk units and chairs, air conditioner and a micro-fridge (microwave and refrigerator/freezer unit). The windows are sectioned in three parts with opening windows on the outer sides. There are blinds on each window. Two students share each room, 4 students share a suite. There is a lounge on the top floor with a kitchen and two televisions. A free laundry room is located on each floor. Food and beverage machines are located in the Dining Hall. **Tip:** bring detergent for laundry!

Are the residence halls safe and who staffs them?

Security is on duty 24/7. Entry to the College and to the residence hall is carefully regulated and all spaces at Moore require the swipe of a unique ID card for entry. ID cards are carefully monitored by our Resident Life Staff and held only by SADI students and key Program Staff. There are always staff members on duty in the residence halls. RA's live on each floor of the dorm building, along with the residents. The live-in staff members are Moore students and are supervised by the Residence Life Coordinator and the Dean of Students. In addition, there is 24/7 security.

Will I have a curfew?

Yes! SADI students have a 9:30 p.m. curfew every night.

Am I allowed to have visitors and guests?

Nope, outside visitors may not visit the college under any circumstances for the duration of the SADI program due to precautions related to COVID-19. In the event of emergency, illness, or behavioral discharge, the student's emergency contact may pick the student up from the campus to return home.

How do I do my laundry?

There is free laundry available for SADI students in Stahl Hall – but don't forget to bring your own detergent! Not sure how to do it? We've got you – [check out this how-to guide!](#)

Is room and board included in the tuition for this program?

Yes! All meals and housing are provided by Moore College and part of the total tuition fees. Breakfast, Lunch and Dinner are served Monday through Friday. Brunch and Dinner are served on Saturday and Sunday.

COVID-19 SAFETY PRECAUTIONS

What safety measures have been put in place for in-person programs in response to COVID-19?

As of this time, we plan to host SADI 2022 as an in-person, on-campus experience. We will continue to follow guidelines from the CDC and the City of Philadelphia Department of Public Health regarding COVID-19. Safety measures include:

- COVID-19 test provided for all SADI participants upon arrival to campus on July 11
- Shared room in residence halls (two students per room)
- Masks required
- Distanced classroom and studio setups
- Ample sanitizing spaces across campus

Are scholarships available?

Can I pay for the program in installments?

Yes, provided full tuition is received by the deadline of June 1.

SADI EXTRACURRICULARS: LIFE OUTSIDE OF CLASS

What student activities are offered outside of class?

Activities scheduled outside of class provide opportunities to meet other students, become better acquainted with the College, and discover Philadelphia. Some events relate to admission to degree programs and career exploration. All students will be given a calendar with all extracurricular activities during orientation on the first day of the program.

Am I allowed to leave campus by myself?

Please note: this item is subject to change due to COVID-19 precautions. SADI students are able to leave campus during designated free times to visit approved locations within walking distance (ex: Target, Rittenhouse Square Park, Rittenhouse Shopping District, Boar's Head Deli, Logan Square, Parkway Museums, Rite Aid, CVS, Wawa), but must do so with at least two other individuals or a SADI Program Staff Member. No Summer Art & Design Institute student is permitted to leave Moore on their own at any time for any reason. Participants may leave with approved emergency contacts/family members during free time. Please remember that check-in hours are still in effect. There are no exceptions to this rule. SADI students are not permitted to leave Philadelphia outside of SADI sanctioned trips or with parents or guardians.

What will I do on weekends?

On Friday evenings, participate in some awesome evening field trips with your classmates! On Saturdays, experience more of what Philadelphia has to offer with a selection of special field trips to locate destinations. On Sundays, relax, catch up on sleep, do homework on this unscheduled day

What about the rest of my free time? Will I be all alone?

SADI is a supportive environment full of creatives just like you! Students bond quickly and feel right at home at Moore and its surrounding area. During class hours, you will be with faculty members and classmates. At lunch break, you can go to one of the student meeting areas, the dining locations, or check out nearby restaurants. After class, you'll complete interesting art-based homework assignments, eat, participate in movie and game nights, and enjoy leisure time.

Will I be able to see Philadelphia while I am studying there?

Yes! Visits to museums, exhibitions, and other places of interest are scheduled during class hours to provide inspiration for your work.

Will I be safe in Philadelphia?

Moore is located in a very safe area of Center City Philadelphia. Students are advised to follow common sense safety precautions, such as walking with groups and being aware of their surroundings.

INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

Do I need to apply for a student visa?

Yes! You must have a student visa to be eligible for SADI.

Is there a language requirement?

Students whose first language is not English must submit TOEFL or SAT scores.

BEFORE YOU ARRIVE

Pay your tuition and complete your required forms

Be sure to complete your tuition payment by the deadline (June 1) and submit your health and immunization form. If possible, get your COVID-19 vaccine.

What should I bring with me?

[Face masks](#), Bedding for a twin XL bed (sheets, pillows, blankets), clothes, rain jacket, umbrella, cell phone and charger, laundry detergent and dryer sheets, laundry bag, towels, personal hygiene products, sunscreen, sunglasses, comfortable walking shoes (sneakers), 32GB flash drive, heavy duty orange extension cord (thin white or brown extension cords are not permitted). No worries! Target, convenience stores, and Rite Aid are just blocks away should you forget anything at home. Unfortunately, since there is no storage space for student belongings in our mail room, we cannot accept packages.

AFTER THE PROGRAM IS OVER

How can I get my grade and transcript?

At the end of the program, your grade will be mailed to you. Official Transcripts must be requested from the Registrar's Office and there is a link for this on the website.

WHAT IF THE SADI HAS TO SHIFT 100% ONLINE?

Our first priority at Moore College of Art & Design is the health and safety of our entire community—that's why in summer 2020, we shifted SADI to an online format, given the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic. **And guess what? We still had a blast!**

Online SADI classes utilized a mix of creative learning approaches and a range of formats, including small group discussions and demonstrations. Our faculty created a flexible, fun and engaging virtual learning environment, with a structured weekly calendar of regularly scheduled classes and check-ins via email and Slack messenger. Students enjoyed a wide range of activity throughout each day—and not all of it took place in front of a screen!

We customized our course schedule to include our most popular offerings, and the ones that work best for online learning and career prep:

- Animation
- Foundation Studio I: Drawing
- Illustration
- Foundation Studio II: Visual Thinking & Color Theory
- Painting OR Game Design

Students also received FREE access to Adobe Creative Cloud and a complimentary at-home SADI Essentials Kit, valued at over \$400, featuring high-quality art supplies: drawing pads, canvases, colored pencils, chalk pastels, acrylic paints, charcoal and more!

- Weekly talks with successful Moore alumni like Isabelle Staub and Amy Ignatow
- Professional development workshops on college prep, career prep, exhibition submissions, social media presence, home studios and creative mindfulness
- Portfolio preparation and mock interviews with Moore's Admissions staff
- Virtual Study Halls for mentoring with Moore BFA students and completing homework
- A culminating online exhibition on Moore's website, featuring individual galleries of each student's art and design work
