DESCRIPTION

The **Summer Art & Design Institute (SADI)** is a four-week, three-credit residential pre-college program open to creative young women & non-binary students in grades 10 – 12.

Whether you're new to art or interested in fleshing out a portfolio for college, SADI has an experience that's just right for you. This fun and inspiring sleepaway experience is the perfect next step for young artists considering enrolling in art school and exploring creative careers.

SADI students learn from award-winning Moore faculty and artists, enjoy Moore's state-of-the-art facilities, and receive multiple opportunities to explore the cultural hub of Philadelphia through lectures, museum visits, studio tours and community events.

ACADEMIC INFO

When do I attend class?

Monday - Friday, 9:00 am – 4:00 pm + 1-hour lunch from 12:00 pm – 1:00 pm

Where are classes held and who teaches them?

Classes take place in Moore's beautiful BFA classrooms and labs – unique, modern facilities with state of the art equipment and technology! All SADI courses and workshops are taught by Moore's esteemed BFA faculty and a select group of Philadelphia-based artists and designers.

What classes will I take?

Students choose **4 concentrations of study** modeled after Moore's undergraduate course offerings. To support their concentrations, all students are automatically enrolled in two foundation studios. Weekly concentration options include:

- animation
- character design
- ceramics
- interior design
- illustration
- fashion design
- photography
- painting
- graphic design
- game design
- printmaking
- filmmaking

Will I have homework?

Yes, students are responsible for independently completing 1-2 hours of interesting, art-focused homework per day. Students have evening access to Moore's facilities to complete their assignments with help from Moore's BFA students during weeknights. **Completing homework = college credits.**

Will I receive grades, a transcript, and college credit for the courses I take?

Yes! Grades are issued for all students enrolled in Summer Art & Design Institute. Students who successfully complete SADI receive 3 undergraduate level credits. Students are graded for each class. These grades are averaged for the final 3 credits. After the conclusion of the program, you may request a transcript showing the college credits you've earned. The 3 foundations year college credits you earn may always be used to get ahead at Moore. They are also accepted at most other colleges, depending on their admissions and credit transfer process.

Am I allowed to be absent?

No no-shows, please! Students are expected to attend classes regularly and arrive on time.

What should I bring for the first day of class?

Moore provides the art supplies for all classes. Just bring yourself and your provided portfolio bag.

HOUSING INFO

Is room and board included in the tuition for this program?

Yes! All meals and housing are provided by Moore College and part of the total tuition fees. Breakfast, Lunch and Dinner are served Monday through Friday. Brunch and Dinner are served on Saturday and Sunday.

Am I required to live in the residence halls?

Yes - all students are required to live on campus.

Where are the dorms in relation to the classrooms?

Students do not need to leave the building or go outside to enter the dining hall or go to class. Our campus consists of three buildings; Stahl Hall, the Wilson Building, and the Sarah Peter Building, which are all connected and enclosed.

What amenities are available in the residence halls?

All rooms are two-bedroom suites with an adjoining bathroom. Rooms are equipped with dressers and closets, two twin beds, two desk units and chairs, air conditioner and a micro-fridge (microwave + refrigerator/freezer unit). Two students share each room, 4 students share a suite. There is a lounge on the top floor with a kitchen and two TVs. Free laundry is located on each floor. Food and drink machines are located in the Dining Hall. **Tip: bring detergent for laundry!**

Are the residence halls safe and who staffs them?

Security is on duty 24/7. Entry to the College and to the residence hall is carefully regulated and all spaces at Moore require the swipe of a unique ID card for entry. ID cards are carefully monitored by our Resident Life Staff and held only by SADI students and key Program Staff. There are always staff members on duty in the residence halls. RA's live on each floor of the dorm building, along with the residents. The live-in staff members are Moore students and are supervised by the Residence Life Coordinator and the Dean of Students.

Will I have a curfew?

Yes! SADI students have a 9:30 p.m. curfew every night.

Am I allowed to have visitors and guests in the dorms?

Nope, outside visitors may not enter the dorms under any circumstances for the duration of the program due to safety and precautions related to COVID-19.

How do I do my laundry?

There is free laundry available for SADI students in Stahl Hall – but don't forget to bring your own detergent!

PAYING TUITION

Are scholarships available?

Can I pay for the program in installments?

Yes, provided full tuition is received by the deadline of May 1.

What is the refund policy?

Written notification of course withdrawal is required and must be submitted via email to ce@moore.edu. After receiving written notice, our team will confirm your refund amount according to the following schedule and provide you with the required tuition refund forms for you to complete. Please note that all refunds are processed in the form of direct deposit or paper check within 4–6 weeks. Tuition refunds are calculated according to the following schedule:

- Withdrawal prior to April 1: 100% less non-refundable deposit
- Withdrawal prior to May 1: 70% less non-refundable deposit
- Withdrawal after May 1: no refund
- Please note that students dismissed from the program due to code of conduct violations do not receive refunds.

INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

Do I need to apply for a student visa?

Yes! You must have a student visa to be eligible for SADI.

Is there a language requirement?

Students whose first language is not English must submit TOEFL or SAT scores. Minimum TOEFL scores are 500 (paper exam); 173 (computer exam); or 61 (internet exam).

Whom should I speak with if I have more questions?

LIFE OUTSIDE OF CLASS

What student activities are offered outside of class?

Activities scheduled outside of class provide opportunities to meet other students, become better acquainted with the College, and discover Philadelphia. Some events relate to admission to degree programs and career exploration. All students will be given a calendar with all extracurricular activities during orientation on the first day of the program.

Am I allowed to leave campus by myself?

SADI students are able to leave campus during designated free times to visit approved locations within walking distance (ex: Target, Rittenhouse Square Park, Rittenhouse Shopping District, Boar's Head Deli, Logan Square, Parkway Museums, Rite Aid, CVS, Wawa), but must do so with at least two other individuals or a SADI Program Staff Member. No Summer Art & Design Institute student is permitted to leave Moore on their own at any time for any reason. Participants may leave with approved emergency contacts/family members during free time. Please remember that check-in hours are still in effect. There are no exceptions to this rule. SADI students are not permitted to leave Philadelphia outside of SADI sanctioned trips or with parents or guardians.

What will I do on weekends?

Weekends are mostly unscheduled, to provide time for rest, extra studio time, city explorations with friends and family visits. Staff may organize optional city tours, field trips and fun social activities on weekday evenings and weekends.

What about the rest of my free time? Will I be all alone?

SADI is a supportive environment full of creatives just like you! Students bond quickly and feel right at home at Moore and its surrounding area. During class hours, you will be with faculty members and classmates. At lunch break, you can go to one of the student meeting areas, the dining locations, or check out nearby restaurants. After class, you'll complete interesting art-based homework assignments, eat, participate in movie and game nights, and enjoy leisure time.

Will I be able to see Philadelphia while I am studying there?

Yes! The surrounding city of Philadelphia is completely accessible and walkable. Visits to museums, exhibitions, and other places of interest are scheduled during class hours to provide inspiration for your work.

Will I be safe in Philadelphia?

Moore is located in a very safe area of Center City Philadelphia. Students are advised to follow common sense safety precautions, such as walking with groups and being aware of their surroundings.

BEFORE YOU ARRIVE

Pay your tuition and complete your required forms!

What should I bring with me?

[Face masks](#), Bedding for a twin XL bed (sheets, pillows, blankets), clothes, rain jacket, umbrella, cell phone and charger, laundry detergent and dryer sheets, laundry bag, towels, personal hygiene products, sunscreen, sunglasses, comfortable walking shoes (sneakers), 32GB flash drive, heavy duty orange extension cord (thin white or brown extension cords are not permitted). No worries! Target, convenience stores, and Rite Aid are just blocks away should you forget anything at home. Unfortunately, since there is no storage space for student belongings in our mail room, we cannot accept packages.
